

## Two charged with grand theft/stolen property

According to Clark Police Chief Jeremy Wellnitz, "Early Sunday morning, at approximately 1:00 a.m. the Clark Police Department conducted a traffic stop near North Clinton St. and 3rd Ave. NW. After a search of the vehicle, multiple items of stolen property were discovered. Through the investigation it was discovered some of the stolen property in the vehicle was linked to the property of a vehicle that was reported stolen during the overnight hours of 5/28/16 and 5/29/16. This vehicle was located abandoned near the Clark Airport.

"The driver, Donny Eng and passenger Jordan Hartman-Johnson, both from Minnesota were arrested and charged with criminal entry in motor vehicle, grand theft, intentional damage to property and possession of stolen property. Eng and Hartman-Johnson were transported to the Codington County Detention Center where they are being held on \$5,000 cash/surety.

"The investigation is ongoing by the Clark Police Department with assistance from the Clark County Sheriff's Office."

# 'The 532' is all about the Christian faith

Kicking off 'The 532' service event is a Family Fun Day, on Saturday, June 4, at the United Methodist Church parking lot, starting at 3:00 p.m. From 5:32 to 6:30 will be a concert by Wellspring which includes Reeves and three others.

Have you been wondering what the 532 promotion is all about?

Sure, we all know that the telephone prefix for Clark is 532. Taking that a step further, it is a goal of a group of Christian leaders in Clark "to bring (human) sheep back to the fold.

"Some people would rather get a root canal at the dentist office, than go to church," said United Methodist Church Pastor Mark Tracy and he explained that "all of us know that there is a hunger out there," and he continued "Someone once said 'I love your Jesus - just not your church.'"

Starting this Sunday evening, at 5:32 p.m., at the Lookout restaurant in Clark, 'The 532' will be a weekly occurrence. During June, July and August the service will host a series called 'Alpha'. Alpha is a service exploring the Christian faith, involving food, a video and conversation.

Pastors Tracy and Kevin Petersen of the Clark Assembly of God Church, along with passionate parishioners welcome this opportunity to talk individual Christian spirituality in a non-threatening place without intimidation whatsoever. No offering and no attendance

will be taken. Child care will be offered after the first week. Come as you are, said Pastor Tracy

"What we are not trying to do is to pull people in from other churches," said Pastor Tracy and he adamantly commented, "this is not about a certain denomination, it is about a relationship with Christ."

Pastor Tracy feels very strongly about his Christian faith. "I believe God wants a revival into the 532 area," he said.

"This is personal for me," he stated passionately. "I'm a pastor today because I was a very broken individual. I could not find wholeness in anything. I'm now doing what I was born to do. I really believe - here's my prayer - 'We will have a whole big group going to church, each and every church, each and every Sunday.'"

Pastor Tracy knows that this isn't an easy task and he's not in it alone, as fellow pastor Petersen as well as others are helping out with 'The 532'.

Everyone knows Michael Sanchez from his Tae Kwon Do events, but he also is a Latino Ministry prayer team leader. "Yes, I grew up in a ghetto setting and considered

myself a fighter, but now my fight is to get people to love Jesus and his gospel as much as I do. I'm still learning in my faith. But there is peace, it's a different peace through Jesus."

Pastor Tracy ended, "There is only one chapter 5 in all of the New Testament. It is from the book of Luke. Luke 5:32, in Jesus words, 'I have come to call not on those who think they are righteous, but those who know they are sinners and need to repent.' It is so God - it's perfect."

The group will get started Sunday at 5:32 p.m. "We are intentionally starting late. God is good!"
