Clark School Board election is set for Tuesday, June 18

The May meeting of the Clark School Board was held on Monday, May 13 in the Clark High School library at 6:30 p.m.

The Board of Governance voted for the West River At-Large Representative (Superintendent) for the SDHSAA Board. The candidates are Kelly Daughters of Faith School District, Chris Long of Lyman School District, Mark Naugle of Custer School District, Erik Person of Lead-Deadwood School District and Cory Strasser of Rapid City School District. Clark High School Superintendent Travis Arhens recommended Mark Naugle.

Next, the board voted for the Native American At-Large Represen-

tative for the SDHSSA Board of Directors. Francic Big Crow of Lakota Tech High School, Tre'voun Buffalo of Wakpala High School, Rich Crow Eagle of Tiospa Zina High School and Chuck Wilson of Todd County High School are the candidates. Ahrens recommended Rich Crow

The board voted yes on the proposed Amendment No. 1 of SDH-SAA Constitution, to amend Chapter 11, Part 1, Section 6 on Amatuer Standing of the SDHSAA By-Laws. "It deals with NIL (name, image, likeness) predominantly effected college sports for the most part," explained Ahrens. "Here at the high school level in South Dakota, essentially, students can't make money
