"The annual publication of these financial summaries is important to ensuring South Dakotans are informed about an important segment of the financial industry doing business in our state," South Dakota NewsMedia Association Executive Director David Bordewyk said. "Publishing these notices in the local newspaper informs South Dakotans in a trusted, trans-

parent manner and creates a permanent public record. That is why public notices published in the local newspaper remain vital in our democracy."

More than eight out of 10 South Dakotans cite their local newspaper as the "most trusted" source for public notices such meeting minutes, bid notices and the insurance company financial summaries. 

Counselor Mrs. Felicia Hofman will recognize the valedictorian and salutatorian, the honor students






