Colin Anderson is sentenced to State Penitentiary

The Third Circuit Court of South Dakota was held Monday, at the Clark County Courthouse with Judge Carmen Means, presiding.

Criminal and civil court lasted much of the morning and according to Kimberly Zachrisson the Deputy State's Attorney, four felony cases were heard, including:

Lonnie Mohr is charged with three counts of Sexual Exploitation of a Minor and one count of Disseminating Material Harmful to a Minor. His case is set for jury trial but

has been moved to new trial dates that have not yet been determined.

William Hasler is charged with three counts of Rape 1st degree and three counts of Rape 4th degree. His case is set for jury trial but has been moved to new trial dates that have not yet been determined.

David Kohrs pled guilty to Sexual Exploitation of a Minor (Class 6 Felony). A psychosexual evaluation was ordered. His sentencing is tentatively scheduled for October 24.

Colin Anderson was sentenced

on four counts of Rape 1st degree (Class C Felony). The Judge sentenced him to 60 years in the South Dakota State Penitentiary on each charge. The Judge suspended 10 years on each charge. The Judge ran each of the sentences concurrently, meaning he will be serving his sentence on all counts at the same time. Mr. Anderson will be in the Penitentiary for a maximum of 50 years. He is eligible for parole in 25 years.
